Dearest:

It is a violation of security to write you at this moment, but I'm not going to tell you anything of military importance, so it should be O.K.

Yesterday ARC suggested that I give them power of attorney to handle income tax matters.. which I did not do, as Dixon already has one power of attorney. As you know, I did not report "Estimate of 1944 Income" this spring, and the papers are still with my personal files. We are about \$76 overpaid from last year, which should be more than enough to handle the difference between the salary deductions made this year and any balance they try to collect. But in case there is any jam... see Dixon, and have him straighten it out. As soon as I get overseas, no money will be deducted from my pay for income tax, and it will all have to be paid when I get back. It will amount to very little, however, about \$7.00 a month, and we should be able to handle it O.K.

You may not hear from me for a long time... but keep your courage, dear, as I am sure everything is going to be fine. I know now where I am going, but cannot tell you. The head man traveling with us is a fine gent however, and he bassures me that it is a grand deal for all of us. He is an expert on donut machines... believe it or not.

I was plenty sick when I talked with you last night, but feel like a million this morning.....I love you.
